Parks Police Report on Anti-Social Behaviour

The police have issued their report on the <u>police patrols over the summer</u> through Canbury Gardens (as well as Latchmere Rec and Elm Road Rec) on Friday and Saturday evenings. They conclude: "The visits and patrols went smoothly without any problems".

The full report contains many anecdotes, we highlight just a few here:

"Two people playing loud music from their boombox were informed to either lower it or switch it off, they complied"... "There were 14 people fishing by the river and they all had their rod licences in Canbury Gardens".. "There were no issues with the music at Canbury Gardens. The Toilet was checked, and it was closed at 20:30 hours with no evidence of drug misuse."

Overall, the police work appears to have been preventative with no problems reported.
