# **Kingsgate Development: update on Canbury Car Park development**

We are now even more convinced that the current planning application for this site, which involves closure of Kingsgate Road and the loss of one southbound lane on Richmond Road, would have serious negative effects on North Kingston. It does not satisfy the principal objectives of the approved plans for the area.

We are pleased that the council has deferred its decision until the new year. CARA is working with other local groups on a coordinated response to go to the council. The plans will be discussed at a Neighbourhood Committee Meeting early in January. The planning application will then be brought to a council meeting for a decision, probably early in February.
